What is the CSSE?

The Canadian Society for Senior Engineers (CSSE) is a Member Society of the Engineering Institute of Canada (EIC), along with nine other Member Societies that represent specific engineering disciplines. CSSE reflects all engineering disciplines. It has full voting privileges and the opportunity to represent its members within EIC on national engineering issues. CSSE is a charitable organization registered by the Canadian Revenue Agency (CRA).

What is CSSE all about? Objectives:

- Assist in the broad field of engineering education for youth who are preparing to enter university, including those already in an undergraduate engineering program;
- Provide financial support to student projects in the field of engineering or science;
- Encourage and facilitate communications between members of the engineering fraternity who are senior in age or experience and who want to keep in touch with their contemporaries by holding CSSE or joint meetings with other EIC Member Societies and engineering organizations, technical speaker luncheons and other functions of broad interest and current societal relevance to all engineers; the Society recognizes noteworthy Members through CSSE Fellowships and nominations to the EIC Honours, Awards and Fellowship process;
- Publish a newsletter or other communication periodically to keep the membership informed of the activities of the Society.
- Maintain an active role in expressing learned opinions, either alone or in concert with other Canadian engineering organizations, on issues of national or regional interest relating to Canadian engineering or technology.
- Contribute to awareness of the history of engineering in Canada.

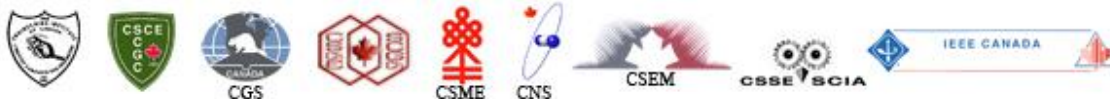
The How and What of Membership: Who can Join?

CSSE is a voluntary organization for all retired, semi-retired, as well as senior or emeritus engineers who remain practicing. CSSE is governed and operated by volunteers; contributions are voluntary. There is an annual fee for membership in CSSE to cover administration costs. Members are requested to make charitable donations to cover CSSE funding of student projects, for which receipts will be issued for income tax purposes.

CSSE replaces the previous Life Members Organization of the EIC. There are no pre-requisites with respect to previous or current membership in other engineering societies.

- Helping support Youth-oriented Engineering and Science-related programs.
